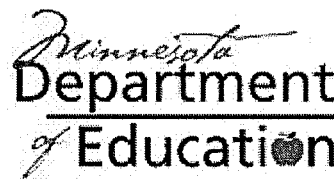

Junior & Senior High School Supply List

Junior and senior high students will need to bring pencils and pens and paper or notebooks for each class.

Mrs. Christianson's English students in Grades 10-12 will be needing a notebook, folder, daily planner, pens, pencils, highlighter, and flash drive (optional but helpful). If you would like to donate a box of kleenex, that would be great, as we go through them quickly. 10th Grade students need to have a book of choice, which can be either fiction or non-fiction.

Mr. Woodman's Math students will be required to have a 3-ring binder, pencils (work done in pen will be unacceptable), and a graphing calculator (a TI-83 is preferred and keep in mind that this model will be used for all math classes at UHS.)

Mrs. Hoyt's Math 7 students should have a simple 4-function calculator, a 3-ring binder with pockets, lined paper, and pencils. 9th & 10th Graders need a TI-83 graphing calculator, folder, lined paper and pencils.

Computer Application Course students must sign the Acceptable Use Policy before they are allowed to log on to the Internet. Each student will be supplied with a Popmail account. This will be the only email allowed during class time. Any violation of this policy will result in total loss of computer privileges.

Mrs. Holtberg's Art Class Students in grades 7-9 will need the following: dozen #2 pencils, 2-pocket folder, 1 subject notebook, large eraser. Students in grades 10-12 will need a dozen #2 pencils and a large eraser.

7th, 8th, 9th, and 10th grade students need to bring tennis shoes and gym clothes for phy ed class.
